1. **The meeting was called to order at 12:00 p.m.** by Janis Lonergan.  
**Roll was taken:** Members unable to attend: Paul Olsen, Van Symons, John Pfautz, Deborah Hamilton, Chuck Hyser, Gary Mann, Mike Nolan. Excused absence: Mike Green, Heidi Storl, Kathleen McInerney.
  
2. Upon **motion** by Ralph Troll and **seconded** by Dara Wegman the **minutes of the February 5, 1998 Faculty Senate meeting were approved.**
  
3. **Report from EPC - David Snowball**
  - (a) **Sociology, Anthropology and Social Welfare**  
**ADD: SO 305 [S] Social Gerontology - 3 credits**  
Examination of aging in human societies, comparing aging in other countries with the U.S. experience. The course will consider issues associated with population change, income and employment, retirement, health and family. Policy programs (Medicare, Social Security, OAA) will be examined as will projections of likely social change. Prerequisite: Introduction to Sociology or permission of instructor.  
  
**DROP: SO 212 Sociology of Aging**  
  
**ADD: AN 340 [S] The anthropology of French North America / 3 credits**  
An ethnohistoric survey of the North American French experience and ethnographic analysis of contemporary North American French identity and culture.  
  
**DROP: AN 300 Peoples and Cultures of Latin America**  
  
**ADD: AN 351 [S-C] People and Cultures of the Caribbean / 3 credits**  
A survey of various peoples and cultures of the Caribbean with special emphasis on creolization during the colonial era and contemporary cultural diversity and commonality. Prerequisite: AN 250

preferred but not required.

**DROP: AN 360 Anthropology of Educational Diversity**

**DROP: SW 420 Social Welfare Research Seminar**

**Seconded** by Peter Kivisto and **approved**.

- (b) **Minor in Women's Studies:** 18 credits including two required courses (WS 230 and WS 420) for 6 credits, at least 9 credits from the Core Courses, and up to 3 credits from the Complementary Courses.

It was **seconded** by Jane Borelli.

Discussion followed on the Women's Studies attachment bottom line (\* = when applicable, designated sections or instructors). Dave Hill made an **amendment** that the words "or instructors" at the bottom of the page be deleted. It was **seconded** by Bob Tallitsch. The discussion followed as to whether the \* was needed next to certain courses, could the \* be deleted all together or should they all have an \*. Vicki Sommer stated that an \* needs to be added to RE 410, as it was just an oversight. The **amendment** was **approved**.

Dave Crowe made an **amendment** to drop the \* and that all complementary courses be approved by the board or a subcommittee in an ongoing fashion. It was **seconded** by Dave Hill. Discussion followed. Bob Tallitsch then made a **motion** to table it and send it back to EPC for further study. It was **seconded** by Mike Finnemann and **defeated**. The amendment to drop the \* was discussed and Janis Lonergan suggested that you could \* Complementary Courses and at the bottom as a description say that these courses are on an ongoing review and note that certain courses would be included with topics that are appropriate. **Seconded** by Jane Borelli and **approved**.

The **original motion** to approve Minor in Women's Studies was **approved**.

- (c) **French**

**ADD: "C" Suffix to WL 217L Topics in French Literature**  
**3 credits**

Offered during spring term of 1997-98

**Seconded** by Sonja Knudsen and **approved**.

(d) **Biology**

**CHANGE: BI 368 Cell Biology /3 credits to BI 210 Cell Biology / 3 credits**  
**The Prerequisite will continue to be CH121 and CH 122**

This course will be added to the list of Core Courses required of all biology majors.

**CHANGE: BI 320 [NB] General Botany / 3 credits to BI 220 [NB] General Botany / 3 credits**

An introduction to the biology of seed plants including anatomy, physiology, reproduction, classification and evolution. Includes one two-hour lab weekly.

Prerequisite: CH 121 and 122, BI 210 or permission of instructor.

**ADD: BI 324 [NB] Plant Morphology (Previously a part curriculum)**

A broad survey of the morphology, reproduction and life cycles of cyanobacteria, fungi, algae, and vascular plants. Includes two two-hour labs weekly.

Prerequisite: BI 220. Offered alternate years.

**BIOLOGY MAJOR: Move BI 263 Nutrition / 3 credits to the Elective category from the Cellular Biology category and move BI 354 Histology / 3 credits into the Cellular Biology category from the Human Biology category.**

**DROP: BI 150 Anatomy and Physiology**

**CHANGE: BI 270 Evolutionary Biology / 3 credits to BI 310 Evolutionary Biology / 3 credits**

BI 230 is a prerequisite for BI 310

**CHANGE: PE 314 Applied Anatomy and Kinesiology to BI 352 Kinesiology**

**CHANGE: Biology Major and Biology Minor**

**Seconded** by Bob Tallitsch and **approved**.
