 3. **Educational Policies Committee – Rick Jurasek**
 - a) **Psychology**
 1. **ADD: PS 220 Psychological Interventions / 3 credits**
Introduction to psychological intervention, including the ethics, assumptions, and theories of counseling. Prerequisites: 100; one of 213, 214, or 216; or by permission of instructor. One section per year.

DROP: PS 431 Tests and Measurements / 3 credits

 2. **Proposed Revisions to the Psychology Department Curriculum. Catalog Copy will read:**

Major in Psychology: 30 credits, including 100, 240, 246, 248, 321, and 410; either 452/453 or 456/457; one development course (213 or 214) one experimental lab course (342, 347, 350); one clinical applications course (220, 320, 421). Majors may not enroll in 216.

Recommended supporting courses: Courses in natural sciences (especially biology and chemistry), computer programming, sociology and mathematics.

Students intending to apply to graduate school in psychology should consult with their advisers for further recommendations.

Major for Teaching Psychology: 33 credits, including 200, 240, 246, 248, 321, 410, 421; either 452/453 or 456/457; one developmental course (213 or 214); one experimental lab course (342, 347, 350); plus an additional 3 credits. Exceptional Child (PS 320) cannot count toward psychology credits for the teaching major. Teaching majors may not enroll in 216.

Minor in Psychology: 21 credits, including 100, 240, 246; either 213 or 214 (216 may be substituted by permission only); one experimental lab course (342, 347, 350); one clinical applications course (220, 320, 421); one additional 3 credit course. Teaching minors may not count 320.

b) **Spanish**

ADD: SN 321 Peninsular Culture and Civilization I / 3 credits

The origin and development of Spanish culture and civilization from prehistory to 1700. One section per year.

SN 322 Peninsular Culture and Civilization II / 3 credits

The development of Spanish culture and civilization from 1700 to the present. One section per year.

SN 326 Latin American Culture and Civilization I / 3 credits

The origin and development of Latin American culture and civilization from indigenous periods to colonial time (1800). One section per year.

SN 327 Latin American Culture and Civilization II / 3 credits

The development of Latin American culture and civilization from 1800 to the present. One section per year.

DROP:

SN 320 Spanish Culture and Civilization / 3 credits (2 sections offered annually)

SN 325 Spanish-American Culture and Civilization / 3 credits (2 sections offered annually)

c) **French**

ADD: WL 227LC Topics in Francophone Literature / 3 credits

Study in translation of literary works originally written in French and dealing with the experience of the people and countries of the Francophone World (Africa, Canada, Indochina, The Caribbean Islands)

DROP: FR 205C The Francophone World: Africa, The Caribbean and Indochina/3 credits

Seconded by Karin Youngberg and **approved**.
