I am seeking information on the fate of Gottfried Carlsson Björklund, b. at Reaby, Gränna Parish (Jön.) Oct. 16, 1832, as well as other members of the Björklund family. The parents, former drummer Carl Björklund, b. June 16, 1794, and wife, Anna Stina Kindahl, b. July 5, 1796, emigr. from Gränna in 1853 with the following children: Frans Wilhelm, b. Aug. 3, 1828, Sara Stina, b. Dec. 19, 1830, Gottfried, b. Oct. 16, 1832, Anders Johan, b. Nov. 29, 1834, Juliana, b. Dec. 16, 1838 and Gustaf, b. Nov. 2, 1840.

According to Norelius, some or all of the Björklunds were at West Point, IN in 1855. Frans Wilhelm went to Rusheba, Chisago Co., MN in 1856 and later to Welch, MN, where he appears in the church register as Frans Wilhelm Carlson. He d. in 1906. Sara Stina and Juliana went to La Porte, IN in 1856, where Sara Stina m. a Mr. Peterson. Gottfried Björklund is named in the 1858 charter of the Vista Lutheran Church, New Richland, MN as "Gottfried Charls." Norelius states that Gottfried and Anders went to Idaho Territory and became wealthy and prominent there. Is Gottfried the 48 year old Swedish quartz miner enumerated in Owyhee Co., ID in 1880 as "Godfrey Charles"?

I am searching for my grandfather's family. He came to Mendocino Co., CA before 1890, where he m. my grandmother, Charlotte Marie Dahl, who was b. in Amnehärad Parish (Skar.). My grandfather left for the gold rush in the Yukon in 1898 and never returned to his family (wife and four daughters). We have a paper which he wrote in order to get a pension in Canada, which tells something about him, although we cannot make out his parish of birth. The document was sent to the British Consul in Strömstad, Sweden and was dated Dawson, Yukon Territory, Canada Oct. 1, 1930. Here is his my grandfather's statement:

"My name is August Gustave Wikstrom. I am a Swede by birth. I was born April 29, 1858. I adopted the name of August Gustave Wikstrom after running away from a Norwegian ship in Liverpool, England. I was born in *Rose Sterno Socken*, Bohuslän. My Christian name was August Andreasson and my father's name was Andreas Anderson, often called Wikstrom after the place where we were living, called Wiken. My mother's name was Helena Mattias, before marriage to my father. When I left Sweden I had a brother Lorentz and a sister Mathilda."

My grandmother's sister, Ottilia Dahl was m. to a chap named Bock. She had two sons, Gunnar and Kurt. Gunnar was living in Borås, Sweden, but we have not heard from them since my grandmother's death in 1944.
