Asplund, Hammarberg

My great grandfather, Emil Arvid Asplund, b. in Södertälje, Sweden Aug. 19, 1849, was graduated from the Ultuna Agricultural College in Ultuna, Sweden in 1872. He emigr. to the U.S. some time between 1882 and 1885 together with his wife, Florentine Andriette Hammarberg, b. in Hudiksvall, Sweden Jan. 14, 1844 and their dau. Sigrid, b. in Stockholm in 1874. My grandfather, Emil Constantin Asplund, was left behind in the care of foster parents. I have learned that my great grandfather had two additional daughters in America, their names possibly being Florentine and Constance.

Since I am going to be visiting the U.S. this winter, I would be very happy if I could meet some of my American relatives.

Oct. 14, 1863, who emigr. to the U.S. in 1868 with her parents, Lars Fredrik Holm, b. in Bro Parish (Värm.) April 29, 1831 and Carolina Andersdotter Nilsson, b. in Hallerud, Kila Parish Jan. 20, 1842, and a sister, Julia Maria, b. Oct. 12, 1865, who d. young. Anna Charlotta Holm reportedly was left with another family, when the mother went to Wisconsin with two other children, b. in the early 1870's. The father, Lars Holm, had evidently d. by that time.

Feb. 9, 1860, Augusta, b. Aug. 2, 1864 and Carolina, b. Dec. 5, 1867. There is some evidence that descendants now live in Virginia.

Säll, Sall, Jonsdotter

Johanna Charlotta Jonsdotter, b. in Eksjö Parish (Jön.) July 2, 1848, the illegitimate dau. of Stina Carin Jonsdotter, m. Frans Oscar Säll Oct. 30, 1872, who d. Dec. 28, 1899. They had no children.

According to the records of the Höreda and Edshult Parishes (Jön.) her name was removed from the parish rolls April 1, 1901, with the notation that she had gone to America. Despite long and exhaustive studies I have not found her name on any exit registers of emigrants leaving Sweden for the U.S., neither have I found her entry on passenger manifests for the ports of Boston and New York for the time in question.

Checks with the families of her two half brothers, my great grandfather, Johan August Johansson Gräns, who resided in Rockford, IL and his brother, Gustaf Alfred Johansson Gräns, who moved from Rockford to Marshall County, KS in 1883, have proved negative.

I hope that some reader will be able to throw some light on the fate of Johanna Charlotta Jonsdotter Säll.

He emigr. from Kristinehman April 3, 1883 and d. in Chicago, IL April 22, 1893. He m. Anna Christina Berggren (known as Annie Anderson in the U.S.), who was b. March 6, 1864. A dau., Alice Gerda Albertina, was b. in Chicago July 23, 1892. Upon her father's death she moved to Sweden to live with her paternal grandfather, but returned to the U.S. sometime after 1900. Additional comment on Query No. 26

Pehr Johan Bratt was b. in Karleby Parish (Skar.) Sept. 29, 1828, the s. of Sven Jonsson, a farmer (*inhysesman*), and Maja Sabel. At the time the family moved to the neighboring parish of Slöta (Skar.) in 1844, Sven Jonsson seems to have added the surname Bratt. All his three sons used this name. Pehr Johan, who called himself Peter John in America, arrived in New York July 13, 1852 aboard the Swedish vessel *Swea*.
