### Benefits of a Reading Clinic

A reading clinic provides teacher candidates with the opportunity to:

- Try new things without the fear of failing
- Discover teaching habits
- Draw conclusions on the strategies tested
- Explore new strategies
- Practice using student data to create best fit lessons
- Become more familiar with the challenges of guided reading (organization, time, material availability, student management)
- Have more experience working with struggling readers and feel comfortable and confident in helping them

# Take-Aways

- The effectiveness of a strategy varies depending on the student
- It is important for students to build confidence in literacy
- Encouraging students and showing them that you believe in them increases their self-esteem
- Building stamina is essential for literacy development
- Knowing the students' point of exhaustion is important so they are not pushed too far and no longer enjoy reading
- Providing breaks or time to relax allows students to rejuvenate
- Giving students the option to sit where they would like during independent reading increases engagement
- Building respect and rapport with the students makes them feel more comfortable when making mistakes allowing for more information about their literacy habits to be known
- Using the interest of the students increases their engagement and enjoyment resulting in more meaningful literacy practice
