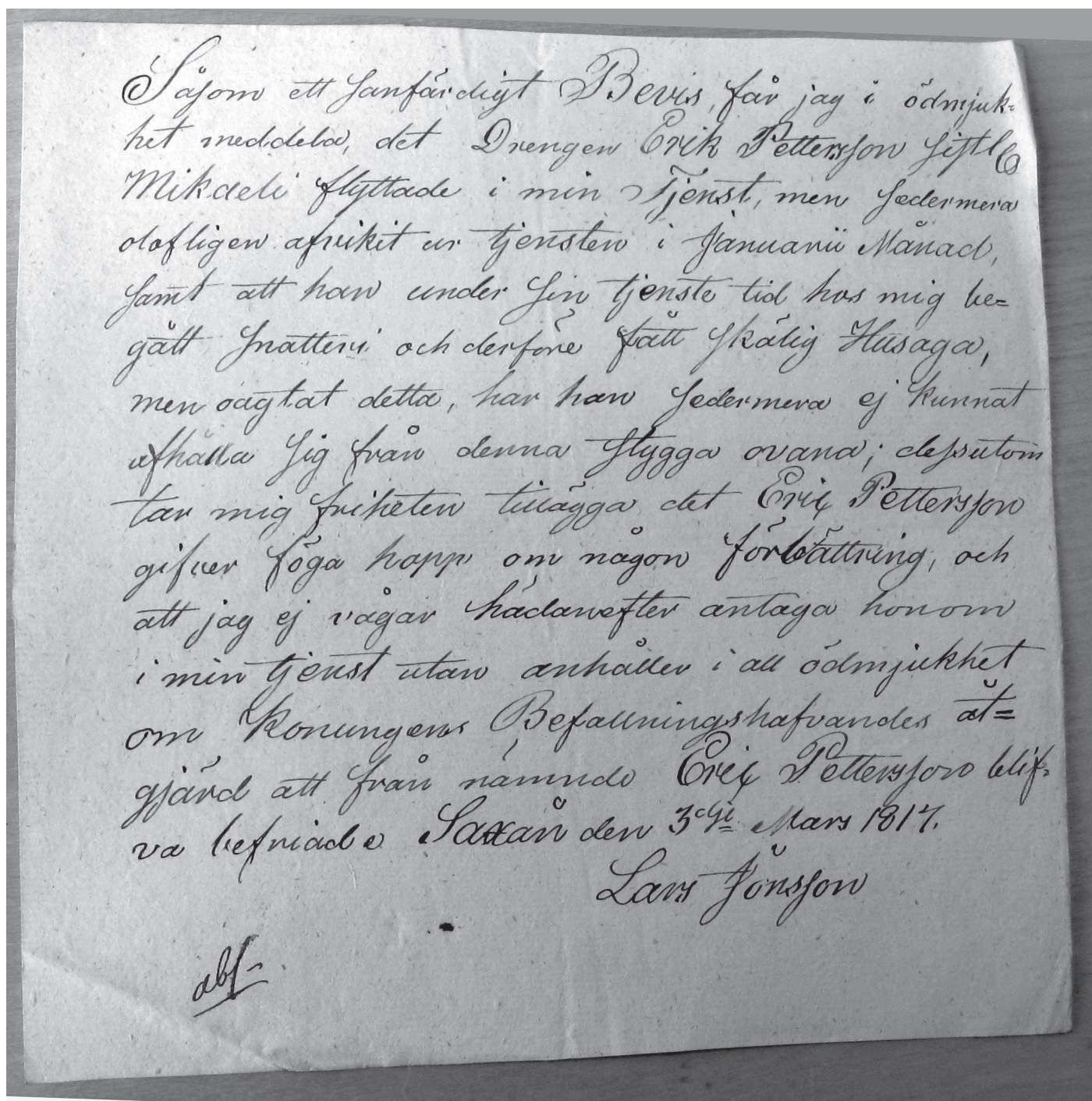

Handwriting Example XXV



This document was found in the "loose papers" (*inneliggande handlingar*) from 1818 in the archives of Färnebo häradsrätt (legal district court). The archive is kept in the Värmlandsarkiv in Karlstad.

These "loose papers" are a collection of documents sent in by officials and the public before each court

meeting, and have some connection to the cases that are to be heard.

These documents are usually not filmed and can only be searched during a visit to the archive.

They can contain many interesting matters, like a copy of a will, a letter from someone to a brother in law who had borrowed money and not paid it

back, an apprentice's contract, or a list of people who had died since the last court meeting. During the early 1900s they can also contain affidavits from America, in connection with a death of a parent, giving addresses of heirs in the U.S.

A little used, but valuable source!
