¹⁷The home-made wooden notebook measures about 4"x 6", with well-used polished wooden covers on front and back, a leather hinge, and leather loops on both wooden covers for holding the pencil and securing the notebook shut. Herman also has Carl's hand-made wooden lock box (about 6"x 6"x 10"), painted black with a red trim, with the date either 1870 or 1876 painted on it. The box is all hand-made—wooden pegs, dove-tail joints, hand-made hinges, and a hand-made lock with key. See Herman Hegberg Interview, Dec. 10, 1988.

¹⁸The Section 36 property was the NW corner of the NWNW, according to his tax receipts. The Sec. 35 land was SE 1/4 of the NW 1/4, a forty-acre parcel. The five-acre parcel's legal description was Lot 4 W 1/2 NENW, Sec. 35. See also the Agreement to buy the Sec. 35 land signed by Lester Perkins and "Charl Högberg" dated 19 Dec. 1883; the Mortgage Deed between Eric Anderson and "Charly" Hogberg, and Lester Perkins dated 16 Feb. 1884; and the Satisfaction Piece between the same men, also on 16 Feb. 1884; originals in possession of Herman Hegberg.

¹⁹Carl was listed as a carpenter in the 1870 and 1880 U.S. Censuses, as a laborer in the 1885 Iowa Census and as a farmer in the 1895 Iowa Census. No occupation was given for him in the 1900 U.S. Census, but the 1905 Iowa Census again listed Carl as a carpenter.

²⁰Boone County Naturalization Record 1281, Carl Högberg, 28 June 1872. Herman Hegberg has the original certificates for Carl's naturalization, including the "first papers," where Carl declared his intention to become a citizen on 28 June 1872, as well as the Final Certificate of Naturalization on 12 October 1874.

²²Peter was married in February of 1911, and the last property tax statement in the collection for Carl Hegberg's property (listed as the Charles Hegberg Estate) was for 1911 taxes, paid in February 1912. See property tax statements for 1910 and 1911 and the 1908 insurance policy with the Swedish Mutual Insurance Association; originals in possession of Herman Hegberg.

Raymond E. Lindgren 1913-1995

Word has just been received of the death 13 April 1995 of Dr. Raymond E. Lindgren of Long Beach, CA. Dr. Lindgren had spent a lifetime as a scholar of Scandinavian history and was at his death Professor Emeritus at California State University in Long Beach. He had a long and distinguished career as professor at Occidental College, University of Wisconsin, Vanderbilt University, the University of Minnesota and as NATO visiting professor at the University of Oslo. He was the author of numerous books and articles, most of them dwelling on his main interest, the interpretation of Scandinavian history. He was the recipient of numerous honors and awards including the knighthood of the Order of the North Star, presented to him by the King of Sweden, and the Gustaf II Adolf medal from the University of Uppsala for his contributions to international education.
