The Swedish Union Guards of Bishop Hill during the Civil War

A Roster of Officers and Men of Company D, 57th Illinois Volunteer Infantry 1861-1865

In Bishop Hill, Illinois, a military company called the Swedish Union Guards was raised during the fall of 1861 and mustered into service on 26 December 1861 as Company D, 57th Illinois Volunteer Infantry. Eric Forsse, a former sergeant in the Swedish Army and the prime organizer of the company, became captain. He later rose to become a major in the regiment. Another well-known member of this company was Eric Johnson, the son of the founder of the Bishop Hill colony, Erik Jansson. Johnson became captain in 1862 and commanding officer of the company. He resigned the same year and was succeeded by Peter M. Wickstrum, a carpenter from Bishop Hill, who served as company commander until the end of the war.

Company D, 57th Illinois Volunteer Infantry fought in the bloody Battle of Shiloh, Tennessee 6-7 April 1862, where a Union army under the command of Ulysses S. Grant was surprised by rebel forces, but managed to hold its ground. It then contributed to the capture of Corinth, Mississippi on 30 May 1862, where it remained as part of the garrison until November 1863. During this time it participated in the Battle of Corinth 3-4 October 1862. After the battle Company D was ordered by the acting regimental commander, Major Eric Forsse, to serve as artillery at Battery Robinette in the inner defense line of the city. After spending some time recuperating in Camp Fry outside of Chicago and on leave at their homes, the company was sent with the rest of the regiment to Athens, Alabama in March 1864. It then took part in Sherman's March through Georgia, South Carolina and North Carolina, as well as the grand victory review in Washington, D.C. 24 May 1865, before being mustered out at Louisville, Kentucky 7 July 1865.

Alstrum, Jonas, 22, single, farmer, Bishop Hill. He had blue eyes, light hair, light complexion and was 5' 7" in height. He enlisted in Bishop Hill 25 Sept. 1861 and was mustered into service in Chicago 26 Dec. 1861 as a corporal for three years. Promoted to corporal 23 Dec. 1861 and to sergeant 30 May 1863;

reduced to ranks 28 Jan. 1864 and discharged in 1864 at the expiration of his term.

Born in Alfta Parish (Gävl.) 14 March 1840; arr. in the U.S. in 1846 in the company of his grandmother. - SPAUS, No.1920; BHR, p.58.

Anderson, Andrew, No. 1, 19, single, farmer, Bishop Hill. He had blue eyes, dark hair, dark complexion and was 5' 61/2" in height. Enlisted in Bishop Hill 25 Sept. 1861. Mustered into service in Chicago 26 Dec. 1861 as a private for three years. Killed in the Battle of Corinth, MS 4 Oct. 1862.

Born in Nora Parish (Väst.) 11 Aug.1842; arr. in the U.S. 1850 with his parents. He was a brother of Olof Anderson (cf. below). - SPAUS, No. 4891; BHR, p. 16.

Anderson, Andrew, No. 2, 49, -, farmer. He had blue eyes,light hair, fair complexion and was 5' 6" in height. He was born in Sweden. Enlisted in Galesburg, IL 7 Nov. 1861. Mustered into service in Chicago 26 Dec. 1861 as a private for three years with Co. E of the 57th Illinois Volunteer Infantry but transferred to Company D 1 July 1862. Re-enlisted as a veteran volunteer 27 Dec. 1863. Mustered out with company 7 July 1865.

He may be identical to Stickå Anders Andersson from Mora Parish (Kopp.), born 16 Feb. 1812. - SPAUS, No. 1199.

Anderson, August, 26, -, farmer, Berlin, IL. He had blue eyes, light hair. light complexion and was 5'5" in height. He was born in Sweden. Enlisted in Berlin 7 Dec. 1861. Mustered into service in Chicago 26 Dec. 1861 as a private for three years. Re-enlisted as a veteran volunteer 27 Dec. 1863. Transferred to Company F of the 57th Illinois Volunteer Infantry 8 Oct. 1864.

Anderson, Charles P., 36, married, sawyer, Moline, IL. He had blue eyes, dark hair, light complexion and was 5' 8" in height. Enlisted in Moline 6 Oct. 1861. Mustered into service in Chicago 26 Dec. 1861 as a private for three years. Discharged in Corinth, MS. 8 July 1862 for disability on a surgeon's certificate.

He came from Hössna Parish (Älvs.) according to a news item in *Hemlandet*, Chicago, IL dated 11 Dec. 1861.

Anderson, John G., 17, -, farmer, Berlin, IL. He had blue eyes, light hair, light complexion, and was 5' 9" in height. Born in Sweden. Enlisted in Bishop Hill 13 Feb.1864. Mustered into service in Chicago 8 March 1864 as a private for three years. Mustered out with company 7 July 1865.

Anderson, Lars, 21, single, farmer, Bishop Hill. He had blue eyes, light hair, light complexion and was 5' 71/2" in height. Enlisted in Bishop Hill 25

Sept. 1861. Mustered into service in Chicago 26 Dec. 1861 as a private for three years. Discharged 1864 after expiration of term.

Born in Bollnäs Parish (Gävl.) 3 June 1840. Arr. in the U.S.1847 with his parents. Wounded in his left side at the Battle of Shiloh, TN 6-7 April 1862. - SPAUS, No. 2015; BHR, p. 62; Hemlandet, 23 April 1862.

Anderson, Lars W., 18, single, farmer, Bishop Hill. He had blue eyes, light hair, light complexion and was 5' 7" in height. Enlisted in Bishop Hill 16 Sep. 1861. Mustered into service in Chicago 26 Dec. 1861 as a private for threee years. Wounded in action at the Battle of Shiloh, TN 6-7 April 1862. Discharged for wounds at camp near Corinth, MS 1 July 1862.

Born in Torstuna Parish (Väst.) 30 Jan. 1844. Arr. in the U.S. 1846 with his parents. His guardian was Swan Swanson, bookkeeper at Bishop Hill. Listed in the household of Charles M. Green (cf. below), harnessmaker, Bishop Hill, in the U.S. Census of 1860. First reported missing in action at the Battle of Shiloh, TN 6-7 April 1862. - SPAUS, No. 1177; BHR, p. 9; Hemlandet, 23 April 1862.

Anderson, Nils P., 22, -, blacksmith, Bishop Hill. He had blue eyes, light hair, light complexion and was 5' 6" in height. Born in Sweden. Enlisted in Bishop Hill 20 Feb. 1864. Mustered into service in Chicago 8 March 1864 as a private for three years. Mustered out with company 7 July 1865.

Anderson, Olof, 20, single, farmer, Bishop Hill. He had gray eyes, light hair, light complexion and was 5' 8" in height. Enlisted in Bishop Hill 14 Sept. 1861. Mustered into service in Chicago 26 Dec. 1861 as a musician (fifer) for three years. Promoted to sergeant 1 July 1862. Re-enlisted as a veteran volunteer 27 Dec. 1863. Promoted to first sergeant 5 April 1864 and to second lieutenant 30 June 1864. Mustered out with company 7 July 1865.

Born in Nora Parish (Väst.) 12 Oct. 1840. Arr. in the U.S. 1850 with his parents. Brother of Anders Anderson, No.1 (cf. above). Wounded at the Battle of Corinth, MS 3 Oct. 1862. - SPAUS, No.4890; BHR, p.16; Hemlandet, 22 Oct. 1862.

Anderson, Peter, No. 1, 22, single, farmer, Bishop Hill. He had blue eyes, light hair, light complexion and was 5' 101/2" in height. Enlisted in Bishop Hill 6 Oct. 1861. Mustered into service in Chicago 26 Dec. 1861 as a private for three years. Promoted to corporal 1 Jan. 1862. Deserted at Pittsburg Landing, TN 18 April 1862.

Born in Bollnäs Parish (Gävl.) 21 Oct. 1839. He arr. in the U.S. with his parents 1850. - BHR, p. 18.

Anderson, Peter, No. 2, 34, married, farmer, Princeton, IL. He had blue eyes, dark hair, light complexion and was 5' 9" in height. Born in Sweden. Enlisted in Princeton 25 Aug. 1862. Mustered out with company 7 July 1865.

Anderson, Peter E., 31, -, farmer, Galva, IL. He had blue eyes, light hair, light complexion and was 5' 51/2" in height. Enlisted in Galva 8 Oct. 1861. Mustered into service in Chicago 26 Dec. 1861 as a private for three years. Reenlisted as a veteran volunteer 27 Dec. 1863. Mustered out with company 7 July 1865.

He came from Ovansjö Parish (Gävl.) He was wounded at the Battle of Corinth, MS 3 Oct. 1862. - Hemlandet, 11 Dec. 1861; 22 Oct. 1862.

Anderson, William, 41, married, farmer, Iowa City, IA. He had blue eyes, dark hair, light compexion and was 5' 8" in height. Born in Norway. Enlisted in Bishop Hill 17 Oct. 1861. Mustered into the service in Chicago 26 Dec. 1861 as a private for three years. Died in a hospital in La Grange, TN 8 Dec. 1862.

Wounded in the arm at the Battle of Shiloh, TN 6-7 April 1862. - Hemlandet, 23 April 1862.

Anglund, Eric, 20, -, farmer, Galva, IL. He had blue eyes, light hair, fair complexion and was 5' 10" in height. Born in Sweden. Enlisted in Galva 12 Feb. 1864. Mustered into service in Chicago 8 March 1864 as a private for three years. Mustered out with company 7 July 1865.

Beck, John, 43, married, mason, Watertown, IL. He had gray eyes, light hair, light complexion and was 5' 7" in height. Enlisted in Watertown 5 Dec. 1861. Mustered into service in Chicago 26 Dec. 1861 as a private for three years. Discharged in 1864 at the expiration of term.

Born in Järvsö Parish (Gävl.) 18 Dec. 1818. Arr. in the U.S. with his family 1849. Father of John P. Beck (cf. below). - SPAUS, No. 2983.

Beck, John P., 17, single, farmer, Watertown, IL. He had blue eyes, light hair, light complexion and was 5' 5" in height. He enlisted in Watertown 26 Jan. 1862. Discharged for wounds 19 Oct. 1862.

Born in Järvsö Parish (Gävl.) 22 Nov. 1846. Arr. in the U.S. with his family 1849. Son of John Beck (cf. above). Wounded in the thigh at the Battle of Shiloh, TN 6-7 April 1862. - SPAUS, No. 2985; Hemlandet, 23 April 1862.

Berglund, Eric, 18, single, printer, Bishop Hill. He had blue eyes, light hair, florid complexion and was 5' 101/2" in height. Enlisted in Bishop Hill 14 Sept.1861. Elected second lieutenant 23 Sept. 1861. Mustered into service in Chicago 26 Dec. 1861 as a second lieutenant for three years. Promoted to first lieutenant 15 April 1862. Mustered out with company 7 July 1865.

Born in Alfta Parish (Gävl.) 21 April 1844. Arr. in the U.S. with his parents 1847. After the Civil War he attended the Military Academy at West Point, where he graduated as number one

in the class of 1865. He was then commissioned in the U.S. Army, retiring 31 March 1896 as a major. - SPAUS, No. 2158; BHR, p. 55; Heitman, 1903, p. 213.

Bloom, Gustaf, 24, single, farmer, Cook County, IL. He had blue eyes, light hair, light complexion and was 5' 51/2" in height. Born in Sweden. Enlisted in Chicago 5 Jan 1862. Mustered into service at Corinth, MS 14 July 1862 as a private for three years. Re-enlisted as a veteran volunteer 27 Dec. 1863. Mustered out with company 7 July 1865.

Bloom, John, 20, single, farmer, Bishop Hill. He had blue eyes, light hair, light complexion and was 5' 10" in height. Born in Sweden. Enlisted in Bishop Hill 3 Nov. 1861. Discharged for diability at Corinth, MS 23 Aug, 1862.

Bremley, Gottlet, 30, -, farmer, Hall, IL. He had gray eyes, brown hair, light complexion and was 5' 6" in height. Born in Germany. Drafted from Pike County, IL. Enlisted in Peoria, IL 17 Nov. 1864. Mustered into service at Peoria 17 Nov. 1864 as a private for one year with Company C of the 57h Illinois Volunteer Infantry but transferred to Company D 24 April 1865. Mustered out with company 7 July 1865.

Broberg, August, 29, single, farmer, Gillson, IL. He had blue eyes, dark hair, light complexion and was 5' 61/2" in height. Enlisted in Gillson 11 Oct. 1861. Mustered into service in Chicago 26 Dec. 1861 as a private for three years. Deserted at Pittsburg Landing, TN 5 April 1862 and returned to the company 10 May 1862. Discharged 1864 at the expiration of term.

He came from Vetlanda Parish (Jön.). He was wounded at the Battle of Corinth, MS 3 Oct. 1862. - *Hemlandet*, 11 Dec. 1861; 22 Oct. 1862.

Bunch, Eli, 30, -, farmer, Cold Spring, IL. He had dark eyes, dark hair, dark complexion and was 5' 11" in height. Born in Indiana. Drafted from Shelby County, IL. Enlisted in Jacksonville, IL 12 Dec. 1864. Mustered into service in Jacksonville 12 Dec. 1864 as a private for one year with Company C of the 57th Illinois Volunteer Infantry but transferred to Company D 24 April 1865. Absent without leave.

Burnison, Charles G., 17, -, farmer, Berlin, IL. He had blue eyes, light hair, light complexion and was 5' 4" in height. Born in Sweden. Enlisted in Bishop Hill 18 Feb. 1864. Mustered into service in Chicago 8 March 1864 as a private for three years. Mustered out with company 7 July 1865.

Calin, Eric, 36, single, farmer, Galva, IL. He had blue eyes, brown hair, light complexion and was 5' 6" in height. Enlisted in Galva 25 Sept. 1861.

Mustered into service in Chicago 26 Dec. 1861 as a private for three years. Reenlisted as a veteran volunteer 27 Dec. 1863. Mustered out with company 7 July 1865.

He came from Ockelbo Parish (Gävl.). - Hemlandet, 11 Dec. 1861.

Crone, Andrew, 34, single, farmer, Bishop Hill. He had blue eyes, light hair, light complexion and was 5' 7" in height. He enlisted in Bishop Hill 25 Sept. 1861. Mustered into service in Chicago 26 Dec, 1861 as a private for three years. Died of disease in Columbus, KY 4 Sept. 1862.

He came from Ockelbo Parish (Gävl.). - Hemlandet, 11 Dec. 1861.

Danielson, Daniel, 20, -, farmer, Bishop Hill. He had gray eyes, dark hair, light complexion and was 5' 61/2" in height. He enlisted in Bishop Hill 14 Sept. 1861. Mustered into service in Chicago 26 Dec. 1861 as a private for three years. Re-enlisted as a veteran volunteer 27 Dec. 1863. Promoted to corporal 26 Jan. 1864. Mustered out with company 7 July 1865.

Born in Ore Parish (Kopp.) 1 Dec. 1840. Arr. in the U.S. with his parents 1853. - BHR, p.81.

Dauber, Peter, 44, -, farmer, Henry, IL. He had hazel eyes, brown hair, light complexion and was 5' 81/2" in height. Born in Germany. Drafted from La Salle County, IL. Enlisted in Peoria, IL 30 Sept. 1864. Mustered into service in Peoria, IL 30 Sept. 1864 as a private for one year. Died in the U.S. Army Hospital in Madison, IN 17 May 1865 of chronic diarrhea and pneumonia.

Eastlund, Charles E., 40, -, harnessmaker, Bishop Hill. He had blue eyes, dark hair, light complexion and was 5' 5" in height. Born in Sweden. Enlisted in Bishop Hill 18 Feb. 1864. Mustered into service in Chicago 8 March 1864 as a private for three years. Discharged for disability with surgeon's certificate in St. Louis, MO 28 Jan. 1865.

Erickson, Andrew, 18, -, farmer, Chicago, IL. He had blue eyes, brown hair, light complexion and was 5' 8" in height. Enlisted in Chicago 29 Feb. 1864. Mustered into service in Chicago 29 Feb. 1864 as a private for three years. Mustered out with company 7 July 1865.

Born in Gnarp Parish (Gävl.) 18 June 1846. - SPAUS, No. 4689.

Erickson, Charles J., 14, single, farmer, Moline, IL. He had blue

eyes, light hair, light complexion and was 5' 0" in height. Born in Sweden. Enlisted in Moline 11 June 1862. Mustered into service in Corinth, MS 14 July 1863 as a drummer for three years. Re-enlisted as a veteran volunteer 27 Dec. 1863. Mustered out with company 7 July 1865.

Erickson, Eric, 40, married, farmer, Moline, IL. He had blue eyes, light hair, light complexion and was 5' 6" in height. Born in Sweden. Enlisted in Moline 6 Jan. 1862. Mustered into service in Corinth, MS 14 July 1863 as a private for three years. Re-enlisted as a veteran volunteer 27 Dec. 1863. Mustered out with company 7 July 1865.

He may be the same person as Erik Eriksson from Alfta Parish (Gävl.) who received passport in Gävle $10\,\mathrm{Aug}$. 1846. - SPAUS, No. 2184.

Erickson, John, 32, -, farmer, Truro, IL. He had blue eyes, light hair, fair complexion and was 5' 8" in height. Born in Sweden. Enlisted in Galva, IL 15 Feb. 1864. Mustered into service in Chicago 8 March 1864 as a private for three years. Mustered out with company 7 July 1865.

Erickson, Jonas, 45, -, blacksmith, Bishop Hill. He had blue eyes, light hair, light complexion and was 5' 111/2" in height. Born in Sweden. Enlisted in Bishop Hill 18 Feb 1864. Mustered into service in Chicago 8 March 1864 as a private for three years. Mustered out with company 7 July 1865.

He may be the same person as Jöns Ericsson from Torstuna Parish (Väst.), born 13 May 1810. - BHR, p.11.

Erickson, Lars, 19, single, farmer, Bishop Hill. He had blue eyes, light hair, light complexion and was 5' 6" in height. Enlisted in Bishop Hill 25 Sept. 1861. Mustered into service in Chicago 26 Dec. 1861 as a private for three years. Re-enlisted as a veteran volunteer 27 Dec. 1863. Mustered out with company 7 July 1865.

Born in Malung Parish (Kopp.) 4 Jan. 1842. Arr. in the U.S. with his parents 1846. - SPAUS, No. 1258; BHR, p. 40.

Forsell, Jonas, 20, single, farmer, Bishop Hill. He had blue eyes, light hair, light complexion and was 5' 81/2" in height. Enlisted in Bishop Hill 16 Sept. 1861. Mustered into the service in Chicago 26 Dec. 1861 as a wagoner for three years. Re-enlisted as a veteran volunteer 27 Dec. 1863. Committed suicide in a fit of insanity in Louisville, KY 27 June 1865.

Forsse, Eric, 43, married, tailor, Bishop Hill. He had blue eyes, light hair, light complexion and was 5' 7" in height. Enlisted in Bishop Hill 14 Sept. 1861. Mustered into service in Chicago 26 Dec. 1861 as a captain for three years. Promoted to major 15 April 1862.

Born in Malung Parish (Kopp.) 4 March 1819. Arr. in the U.S with his family 1850. Father of Olof Forsse (cf. below). Listed as a farmer in the U.S. Census of 1860. - SPAUS, No. 4796; BHR, p. 40. (See also Dalregementets historia, volume 3, Falun, 1993, pp. 270-272).

Forsse, Olof, 22, single, farmer, Chicago. He had blue eyes, light hair, light complexion and was 5' 5" in height. Enlisted in Chicago 21 Feb. 1864. Mustered into service in Chicago 29 Feb. 1864 as a private for three years. Mustered out with company 7 July 1865.

Born in Malung Parish (Kopp.) 8 July 1842. Arr. in the U.S. with his parents 1850. Son of Eric Forsse (cf. above). - SPAUS, No. 4798; BHR, p. 40.

Fredrickson, Claus, 17, single, farmer, Cook County, IL. He had blue eyes, light hair, light complexion and was 5' 51/2" in height. Born in Sweden. Enlisted in Chicago 4 Jan. 1862. Mustered into service in Corinth, MS 14 July 1862 as a private for three years. Re-enlisted as a veteran volunteer 27 Dec. 1863. Mustered out with company 7 July 1865.

Granat, John, 35, married, hostler, Galesburg, IL. He had dark eyes, dark hair, light complexion and was 5' 71/2" in height. Enlisted in Galesburg, IL 8 Oct. 1861. Mustered into service in Chicago 26 Dec. 1861 as a private for three years. Re-enlisted as a veteran volunteer 27 Dec. 1863. Mustered out with company 7 July 1865.

Born in Nora Parish (Väst.) 23 Sept. 1827. - SPAUS, No.4829; Hem-landet, 11 Dec. 1861.

Green, Charles M. [Charles Myrtengren, Carl August Myrtengren], 36, -, harnessmaker, Bishop Hill. He had blue eyes, light hair, light complexion and was 5' 61/2" in height. Enlisted in Bishop Hill 25 Sept. 1861. Mustered into service in Chicago 26 Dec. 1861 as a private for three years. Promoted to corporal 1 Jan. 1862. Killed in the Battle of Shiloh, TN 6 April 1862.

Olson, Eric, No. 1, 17, single, farmer, Bishop Hill. He had blue eyes, light hair, light complexion and was 5' 6" in height. Enlisted in Bishop Hill 4 Dec. 1861. Mustered into service in Chicago 26 Dec. 1861 as a private for three years. Discharged as a minor 8 Feb. 1862.

He was born in Nora Parish (Väst.) 22 April 1845. Arr. in the U.S. with his parents 1850. Brother of Olof Krans (cf. above) and Peter Olson (cf. below). - SPAUS, No. 4874; BHR, p. 17.

Olson, Eric, No. 2, 20, -, farmer, Chicago. He had blue eyes, light hair, light complexion and was 5' 11" in height. Enlisted in Chicago 21 Feb. 1864. Mustered into service in Chicago 29 Feb. 1864 as a private for three years. Mustered out with company 7 July 1865.

He was born in Ovanåker Parish (Gävl.) 28 Jan. 1844. - SPAUS, No. 2024; BHR, p. 29.

Olson, Olof, 34, single, engineer, Victoria, IL. He had blue eyes, light hair, light complexion and was 5' 8" in height. Born in Sweden. Enlisted in Victoria 10 Nov. 1861. Appointed sergeant 23 Dec. 1861. Mustered into service in Chicago 26 Dec. 1861 as a sergeant for three years. Transferred to First Illinois Volunteer Cavalry 1 Sept. 1862. Returned to the company as a private. Discharged 1864 after expiration of term.

Olson, Peter, 22, single, farmer, Bishop Hill. He had blue eyes, light hair, light complexion and was 6' 0" in height. Enlisted in Bishop Hill 25 Sept. 1861. Mustered into service in Chicago 26 Dec. 1861 as a private for three years. Discharged 1864 after expiration of term.

He was born in Nora Parish (Väst.) 7 Oct. 1840. Arr. in the U.S. with his parents 1850. Brother of Olof Krans and Eric Olson (cf. above). - SPAUS, No. 4873; BHR, p. 17.

Olson, William O., 22, single, farmer, Moline, IL. He had dark eyes, dark hair, light complexion and was 5' 81/2" in height. Enlisted in Moline 25 Sept. 1861. Mustered into service in Chicago 26 Dec. 1861 as a private for three years. Promoted to corporal 15 April 1862. Re-enlisted as a veteran volunteer 27 Dec. 1863. Promoted to sergeant 5 April 1864. Mustered out with company 7 July 1865.

He came from Ockelbo Parish (Gävl.). - Hemlandet, 11 Dec. 1861.

Peel, Otto W., 26, single, farmer, Geneseo, IL. He hadblue eyes, dark hair, light complexion and was 5' 91/2" in height. Enlisted in Bishop Hill 16 Sept. 1861. Mustered into service in Chicago 26 Dec. 1861 as a private for three years. Promoted to corporal 1 July 1862. Killed in the Battle of Corinth, MS 3 Oct.1862.

He came from Järeda Parish (Kalm.). - Hemlandet, 11 Dec. 1861.

Peterson, Andrew, 38, single, farmer, Princeton, IL. He had blue eyes, light hair, light complexion and was 5' 91/2" in height. Enlisted in Princeton 12 Oct. 1861. Mustered into service in Chicago 26 Dec. 1861 as a private for three years. Discharged for disability 30 Jan. 1863.

He came from Alseda Parish (Jön.), - Hemlandet, 11 Dec. 1861.

Peterson, Jacob G., 32, -, cabinetmaker, Chicago. He had gray eyes, brown hair, light complexion and was 5' 81/2" in height. Born in Sweden. Enlisted in Chicago 20 Feb. 1864. Mustered into service in Chicago 29 Feb. 1864 as a private for three years. Mustered out with company 7 July 1865.

Peterson, John, 22, single, farmer, Bishop Hill. He had blue eyes, light hair, light complexion and was 5' 7" in height. Born in Sweden. Enlisted in Bishop Hill 7 Nov. 1861. Re-enlisted as a veteran volunteer 27 Dec. 1863 Mustered out with company 7 July 1865.

Peterson, John P., 20, single, farmer, Altona, IL. He had blue eyes, light hair, light complexion and was 5' 8" in height. Enlisted in Bishop Hill 7 Oct. 1861. Mustered into service in Chicago 26 Dec. 1861 as a private for three years. Discharged for disability in Corinth, MS 9 Sept. 1862.

He came from Oppeby Parish (Ög.). - Hemlandet, 11 Dec.1861.

Peterson, Lars J., 26, single, farmer, Swede Bend, IA. He had blue eyes, light hair, light complexion and was 5' 91/2" in height. Enlisted in Swede Bend 10 Oct. 1861. Mustered into service in Chicago 26 Dec. 1861 as a private for three years. Discharged for wounds received at the Battle of Shiloh, TN 3 July 1862.

He came from Tjärstad Parish (Ög.). Wounded in the thigh at the Battle of Shiloh, TN 6-7 April 1862. - Hemlandet, 11 Dec. 1861; 23 April 1862.

Peterson, Magnus, 43, single, farmer, Bishop Hill. He had blue eyes, light hair, light complexion and was 6' 1" in height. Enlisted in Bishop Hill 25 Nov. 1861. Mustered into service in Chicago 26 Dec. 1861 as a private for three yars. Discharged for disability in Corinth, MS 12 July 1862.

He was born in Nyed Parish (Värm.). - Hemlandet, 11 Dec. 1861.

Peterson, Nils, 38, single, farmer, Bishop Hill. He had blue eyes, dark hair, light complexion and was 5' 61/2" in height. Enlisted in Bishop Hill 16 Sept. 1861. Mustered into service in Chicago 26 Dec. 1861 as a private for three years. Discharged for disability 19 July 1863.

He came from Älghult Parish (Jön.). - *Hemlandet*, 11 Dec. 1861. [Note that Älghult is in Kronoberg *län*].

Peterson, Olof, 38, - , - , Chicago. He had brown eyes, brown hair, dark complexion and was 5' 8' in height. Born in Sweden. Enlisted in Missouri 1 June 1864 as a private for one year. Discharged 1865 after expiration of term.

Peterson, Peter, 20, single, farmer, Bishop Hill. He had blue eyes, light hair, light complexion and was 5' 8" in height. Enlisted in Bishop Hill 25 Sept. 1861. Mustered into service in Chicago 26 Dec. 1861 as a private for three years. Discharged for disability in Corinth, MS 10 July 1862.

He was born in Alfta Parish (Gävl.) 26 Dec. 1840.. Arr. in the U.S. with his parents 1846. - BHR, p. 51; SPAUS, 1513.

Peterson, Peter L., 21, single, farmer, Victoria, IL. He had blue eyes, light hair, light complexion and was 5' 6" in height. Born in Sweden. Enlisted in Victoria 20 Dec. 1861. Mustered into service in Chicago 26 Dec. 1861 as a private for three years. Discharged for disability in Louisville, KY 29 May 1862.

He may be identical to Pehr Pehrsson, born in Delsbo Parish (Gävl.) 2 June 1839. - SPAUS, No. 2414.

Peterson, William, 21, single, farmer, Princeton, IL. He had blue eyes, brown hair, light complexion and was 5' 5" in height. Born in Sweden. Enlisted in Princeton 5 Sept.1862. Mustered into service 2 Oct. 1862 as a private for three years. Mustered out with company 7 July 1865.

Pierson, John, 19, -, farmer, Chicago. He had blue eyes, brown hair, fair complexion and was 5' 6" in height. Born in Sweden. Enlisted in Chicago 20 Feb. 1864. Mustered into service in Chicago 29 Feb. 1864 as a private for three years. Mustered out with company 7 July 1865.

Rodeen, George E., [G.E. Rydén], 32, single, farmer, Bishop Hill. He had blue yes, light hair, light complexion and was 5' 8" in height. Enlisted in Bishop Hill 14 Sept. 1861. Appointed sergeant 15 Oct. 1861. Mustered into service in Chicago 26 Dec. 1861 as a sergeant for three years. Promoted to second lieutenant 3 Sept. 1862. Died in a hospital in Corinth, MS 7 Aug. 1863.

He came from Nora Parish (Väst.). - Hemlandet, 11 Dec. 1861.

Rudeman, Olof P., 24, single, farmer, Victoria, IL. He had blue eyes, light hair, light complexion and was 5' 8" in height. Born in Sweden. Enlisted in Wataga, IL 9 Dec. 1861. Mustered into service in Chicago 26 Dec. 1861 as a private for three years. Discharged 1864 after expiration of term.

Sapp, Calvin A., 18, -, farmer, La Harpe, IL. He had blue eyes, light hair, light complexion and was 5' 5" in height. Born in Ohio. Enlisted in Quincy, IL 9 Dec. 1864 as a substitute for Noah O. Butler. Musteredinto service in Peoria, IL 9 Dec. 1864 as a private for one year. Died in a hospital in Goldsboro, NC 8 April 1865.

Seymor, John, 21, -, -, Cook County, IL. He had blue eys, dark hair, fair complexion and was 5' 4" in height. Drafted from Cook County. Enlisted in Chicago 8 Oct. 1864. Mustered into service in Chicago 8 Oct. 1864 as a private for one year. Deserted 8 Jan. 1865.

Stack, William, 22, -, teamster, Green Brush, IL. He had blue eyes, light hair, light complexion and was 5' 3" in height. Born in Ireland. Enlisted in Quincy, IL 30 Nov. 1864 as a substitute for David Ludenbach. Mustered into service in Quincy 3 Dec 1864 as a private for one year. Deserted 8 Jan. 1865.

Stanissear, John B., 33, -, farmer, Rock Run, IL. He had hazel eyes, dark hair, dark complexion and was 5' 6" in height. Born in France. Enlisted in

Dixon, IL 1 Dec. 1864 as a substitute for William H. Grass. Mustered into service in Dixon 5 Dec. 1864 as a private for one year. Mustered out with company 7 July 1865.

Stockard, Harry, 40, -, farmer, Mount Pleasant, TN. He had black eyes, dark curly hair, dark complexion and was 5' 11" in height. Born in Giles County, TN. Enlisted in Lynnville, TN 1 Feb.1864. Mustered into service in Athens, AL 29 July 1864 as an undercook of African descent for three years with Company C of the 57th Illinois Volunteer Infantry. Transferred to Company D of the same regiment 29 Dec. 1864. Mustered out with company 7 July 1865.

Sullivan, John, 21, -, butcher, Eden, IL. He had gray eyes, brown hair, light complexion and was 5' 6' in height. Born in Ireland Enlisted in Joliet, IL 26 Nov. 1864 as a substitute for A.W. Eldridge Mustered into service in Joliet 29 Nov. 1864 as a private for one year. Deserted 8 Jan. 1865.

Swanson, August, 19, -, candymaker, Chicago. He had blue eyes, light hair, fair complexion and was 5' 8" in height. Born in Sweden. Enlisted in Chicago 15 March 1864. Mustered into service in Chicago 20 March 1864 as a private for three years. Mustered out with company 7 July 1865.

Swanson, Nils, 22, single, farmer, Bishop Hill. He had blue eyes, light hair, light complexion and was 5' 91/2" in height. Enlisted in Bishop Hill 25 Sept. 1861. Mustered into service in Chicago 26 Dec. 1861 as a private for three years. Re-enlisted as a veteran volunteer 27 Dec. 1863. Died at the U.S. Army Hospital in Newark, NJ 16 May 1865.

He was born in Järna Parish (Kopp.) 27 Dec. 1839. Arr. in the U.S. with his parents 1853. - BHR, p. 38.

Swanson, Peter, 21, single, farrner, Cook County, IL. He had blue eyes, light hair, light complexion and was 5' 10" in height. Born in Sweden. Enlisted in Chicago 4 Jan. 1862. Mustered into service in Corinth, MS 14 July 1863 as a private for three years. Re-enlisted as a veteran volunteer 27 Dec. 1863. Mustered out with company 7 July 1865.

Thomas, George, 18, -, farmer. He had blue eyes, brown hair, light complexion and was 5' 6" in height. Born in Pennsylvania. Enlisted in Alton, IL 10 Dec. 1864 as a substitute for Monroe Stookey. Mustered into service in Alton 10 Dec. 1864. Deserted 8 Jan. 1865.

Tillman, Nils, 44, married, tailor, Weller, IL. He had gray eyes, light

hair, light complexion and was 5' 71/2" in height. Enlisted in Weller 10 Oct. 1861. Mustered into service in Chicago 26 Dec. 1861 as a corporal for three years. Re-enlisted as a veteran volunteer 27 Dec. 1863. Died of disease at the regimental hospital in Rome, GA 15 June 1864.

He came from Alfta Parish (Gävl.). - Hemlandet, 11 Dec. 1861.

Tollin, Charles, 30, single, farmer, Geneseo, IL. He had blue eyes, light hair, light complexion and was 5' 11" in height. Enlisted in Geneseo 22 Sept. 1861. Mustered into service in Chicago 26 Dec. 1861 as a private for three years. Re-enlisted as a veteran volunteer 27 Dec. 1863. Mustered out with company 7July 1865.

He came from Högby Parish (Ög.). He was wounded at the Battle of Corinth, MS 3 Oct. 1862. - Hemlandet, 11 Dec.1861; 22 Oct. 1862.

Trolin, Eric J., 49, married, wheelwright, Bishop Hill. He had blue eyes, dark hair, light complexion and was 5' 6" in height. Enlisted in Bishop Hill 7 Dec. 1861. Mustered into service in Chicago 26 Dec. 1861 as a private for three years. Died of disease at Corinth, MS 31 Oct. 1863.

He was born in Hög Parish (Gävl.) in 1813. Arr. in the U.S. 1850. He was married and had children. Listed as a wagonmaker in the U.S. Census of 1860. - BHR, p. 109

Valentine, Charles J. I., 39, single, farmer, Geneseo, IL. He had gray eyes, light hair, light complexion and was 5' 61/2" in height. Enlisted in Geneseo 29 Sept. 1861. Mustered into service in Chicago 26 Dec. 1861 as a private for three years. Deserted at a camp near Corinth, MS 28 July 1862.

He came from Stockholm. - Hemlandet, 11 Dec. 1861.

Warner, Andrew G., 25, single, farmer, Andover, IL. He had blue eyes, light hair, light complexion and was 5' 10" in height. Enlisted in Andover 16 Sept. 1861. Appointed corporal 1 Oct. 1861. Mustered into service in Chicago 26 Dec. 1861 as a corporal for three years. Promoted to first sergeant 15 April 1862. Re-enlisted as a veteran volunteer 27 Dec. 1863. Commissioned a second lieutenant but not mustered. Discharged for promotion as captain in the 63rd U.S. Infantry (Colored) 5 April 1864.

He was born in Bjuråker Parish (Gävl.) 13 July 1837. Arr. in the U.S. with his parents 1850. Wounded in the arm above the elbow at the Battle of Shiloh, TN 6-7 April 1862. - SPAUS, No. 3998; Hemlandet, 23 April 1862.

Washington, Aaron, 47, -, farmer, Giles County, TN. He had black eyes, black hair, black complexion and was 6' 1" in height. Born in Charleston, SC. Enlisted in Lynnville, TN 27 Dec. 1863. Mustered into service in Athens, AL 23 April 1864 as an undercook of African descent for three years. Mustered out with company 7 July 1865.

Westlund, Jonas, 38, married, cooper, Bishop Hill. He had blue eyes, dark hair, light complexion and was 5' 8" in height. Enlisted in Bishop Hill 25 Sept. 1861. Mustered into service in Chicago 26 Dec. 1861 as a private for three years. Died in the regimental hospital near Corinth, MS 9 July 1862.

He was born in Alfta Parish (Gävl.) in 1823. Arr. in the U.S. 1847. Widower with a child. - BHR, p. 43.

Wickstrum, Hans, 18, single, farmer, Bishop Hill. He had light eyes, light hair, light complexion and was 5' 7" in height. Enlisted in Bishop Hill 16 Sept. 1861. Mustered into service in Chicago 26 Dec. 1861 as a private for three years. Re-enlisted as a veteran volunteer 27 Dec. 1863. Promoted to corporal 16 Jan. 1864. Transferred to Company C of the 57th Illinois Volunteer Infantry 18 Jan. 1865; transferred back to Company D 24 April 1865. Mustered out with company 7 July 1865.

He was born in Alfta Parish (Gävl.) 21 Sept. 1844. Arr. in the U.S. with his parents 1846. Brother of Olof Wickstrum (cf. below). - SPAUS, No. 1819; BHR, p. 49.

Wickstrum, Olof, 25, single, farmer, Bishop Hill. He had blue eyes, light hair, florid complexion and was 5' 91/2" in height. Enlisted in Bishop Hill 16 Sept. 1861. Appointed corporal 1 Oct. 1861. Mustered into the service in Chicago 26 Dec. 1861 as a corporal for three years. Promoted to sergeant 1 Sept. 1862. Wounded at the Battle of Corinth, MS 3 Oct. 1862. Died of his wounds 7 Oct.

He was born in Alfta Parish (Gävl.) 26 Aug. 1836. Arr. in the U.S. with his parents 1846. Brother of Hans Wickstrum (cf. above). - SPAUS, No. 1816; BHR, p. 49.

Wickstrum, Peter M., 33, married, carpenter, Bishop Hill. He had blue eyes, light hair, light complexion and was 5'7" in height. Enlisted in Bishop Hill 14 Sept. 1861. Appointed first sergeant 1 Oct. 1861. Mustered into service in Chicago 26 Dec. 1861 as a first sergeant for three years. Promoted to second lieutenant 15 April 1862; promoted to captain 3 Sept. 1862. Mustered out with company 7 July 1865.

He was born in Mo Parsh (Gävl.) 3 March 1827. Arr. in the U.S. with his wife and child 1850. - SPAUS, No. 4413; BHR, p. 76.

Wood, Andrew, 42, single, Bishop Hill. Not carried on the regimental books. Discharged for wounds 7 Aug. 1862.

Young, Frank, 26, single, farmer, Princeton, IL. He had blue eyes, light hair, light complexion and was 5' 8" in height. Born in Sweden. Enlisted in Princeton 14 Dec. 1861. Mustered into service in Chicago 26 Dec. 1861 as a private for three years. Re-enlisted as a veteran volunteer 27 Dec. 1863. Promoted to corporal 16 Jan. 1864. Mustered out with company 7 July 1865.

Wounded in the thigh at the Battle of Shiloh, TN, April, 1862. - Hemlandet, 23 April 1862.

Young, Fredrik, 18, -, farmer, Princeton IL. He had blue eyes, light hair, dark complexion and was 5' 5" in height. Born in Germany or Sweden. Enlisted in Princeton 15 Jan. 1862. Mustered into service in Corinth, MS 14 July 1863 as a private for three years. Discharged 1864 after expiration of term.



Uncle in Sweden and Nephew in America

During a short visit to Lindstrom in Chisago County, MN during the fall of 1995 I had the opportunity of visiting the Antique Mall on the city's Main Street. Since Lindstrom is well-known as a Swedish center I was looking for items having a Swedish provenance. There were a few old books, some postal cards and a coffee pot of typical Swedish model, but nothing that really excited me. Then I saw a bunch of letters in a glass case which were for sale. It consisted of a collection of documents which had belonged to a farmer in Almelund in Chisago County, among which was a letter from Sweden, which I acquired and brought back home

The letter was addressed to "Herr P.J. Svensson, Almelund, Chikago, Minesota, North Amerika" and had obviously been mailed without postage from Urshult in the county of Kronoberg, carrying its postal cancellation but the stamp was American, ten cents, and the envelope was stamped "due 10 cents."

The contents of the letter were not overly exciting but created, nevertheless, a certain curiosity. Translated into English it follows below.

"Esbjörnamåla 15 Dec. 1899

As an answer to your very welcome letter which I have received from you, in which I perceive that you have not received any letter in a long time, despite the fact that I have mailed letters to you, I am wondering what has been happening. But for a long time I have not been able to write because of my frail health. My age is far advanced and and my infirmities are many, my dear Svensson. You will have to excuse me for delaying writing to you, but I have not been able to, dear Svensson. I received the letter from Joh Larsson (?) in Esbjörnamåla 12 Dec. 1899, in which I learned of your good health, which is a prized possession here in this world and in our lives, dear Svensson. You must believe that I am very frail now, my eyesight is almost gone causing me difficulties for the most part, so you must believe that old age carries with it a host of problems, but one must accept one's lot. It would be fine if the Lord would give us a better life after this, but we must have faith in the Lord who is all powerful over all created beings in the whole world. May God give us a better life after this. My dear Svensson, I can tell you that the trial is over, but there was nothing for you. All the provisions of the will were locked in, thus it

was the clergyman in Kalvsvik who was unjust. They were all unjust, dear Svensson. You must believe me that I walked great distances in vain, since I believed in justice, but they were wealthy and did as they pleased. My dear Svensson, finally I wish to ask you to help me with a few kronor. You have always been kind to me and you have a good heart. I cannot thank you enough for your kindness to me and God will reward you, my dear Svensson. My infirmities are many but I must accept them to the end. I have nothing further to relate to you except to say that my wife is very frail at times.

With a friendly greeting from Your Uncle
Adam Johansson

Joh Svensson, the farm owner, greets you warmly. You are also greeted by my children who live in the vicinity. I also wish to tell you that we now are having a fine winter. Don't neglect to send us a letter. I will answer if I am still alive."

Who was Adam Johansson and who was "My dear Svensson?" The next thing was to go to the parish records for Urshult and attempt to find Adam in Esbjörnamåla and see if he had a nephew named P.J. Svensson?

In Urshult AI:35, which goes up to 1895, the last one in the archives, we find an entry on p. 8 for Esbjörnamåla:

Gustaf Algot, the foster son, was a grandchild and was the son of Ida Catharina Adamsdotter, b. 26 June 1855.

Adam's parents and siblings

According to the birth records Adam was b. 25 March,1820, bapt. 31 March in Folaboda soldier's croft, the son of Johan Trög, dragoon, and his wife, Hanna Pers-

dotter. Johan Trög belonged to the Småland Light Dragoon Regiment.

According to the household examination roll he had the following family:

In 1822 Johan was given his discharge and he moved to the soldier's croft No. 100, a part of Västerbotorp Storegård, but aready that fall the family moved to Nybygget, a part of the Berg farm. The family expands with

Johan Trög d. in the pensioner's croft at Berg 11 May 1835. He was then very frail. His widow stayed on in the croft until her death 27 Nov. 1859.

Sven, the son, moved around to various locations in Urshult 1830-1841, but in the latter year he moved to *Kalvsvik*, where he res. at Bokudden, a part of Kläckinge farm. He m. Christina Olofsdotter, b. 27 March 1821 in Kalvsvik, d. 2 Sept. 1843, with whom he had a son, Peter Johan, b. 7 March 1842.

In 1850 Sven remarried Elin Olofsdotter, b. 4 Jan. 1805 and in 1861 he, his wife Elin, and son Peter Johan moved to Kläckinge, where Sven d. 26 March 1863.

Peter Johan, the son, m. 10 May 1867 Ingrid Maria Petersdotter, b. 13 Nov. 1838 in Vederslöv. They had a child:

Peter Johan and his wife emigr. 21 April 1869 to the U.S. with 38 others from Kalvsvik, while one person emigr. to Germany.

Adam's children

During the years 1835-1850 Adam moved to various locations in Urshult but after his marriage 1849 he settled in Bokelund, a croft in Esbjörnamåla, where he and wife watched their children grow up:

Christina's children Peter Oskar and Ida Carolina spent the summer and fall of 1897 in Denmark, but returned home at the end of the year.

Ida Catharina, the daughter, moved to Jät in 1874 but came home from Väckelsång in 1885. She had an illegitimate child after having worked for a time in Norrland and moved to Degerfors in northern Sweden 1890.

Peter Johan, the son, moved in 1875 to Esbjörnamåla and in 1880 to Väckelsång. From there he moved to Elofshult, where his sister Ida Catharina also lived for a time. In 1882 Peter Johan moved to Kvarnamåla and in 1884 to Carlsnäs, a part of the Gängeskulla farm. He married 28 Dec. 1883 Albertina Johannesdotter, b.17 Sept. 1861 in Väckelsång. In 1885 they moved to Torstarp, a part of the Kåranäs farm and had the following children:

Carl Johan Algot, son, b. 7 Oct. 1885 Ellen Johanna, daughter, b. 30 Sept. 1887 Hilma Carolina, daughter, b. 20 May 1889

On 19 Sept. 1889 Peter Johan and his family moved to Högbo in Gävleborg County. Anna Lovisa, the daughter, moved to Väckelsång in 1881 but returned home again 1890.

What happened to Peter Johan?

It is apparent that *Peter Johan*, the son of Sven, was the recipient of the letter, and the farmer in Almelund. What do we know about him? Did he have additional children in the new land, after his firstborn had died during the difficult years in Sweden at the end of the 1860s?

We find the answers in the parish records of the Immanuel Lutheran Church in Almelund, founded in 1877.

Peter Johan and his wife resided in the Second District (*rote*) and had arr. in Almelund 21 May 1893, coming from Center City, also in Chisago County. Peter Johan d. in Almelund 16 March 1929 and his wife 22 Oct. 1911. The following children were born after their emigration:

Carl Edvin, the son, seems not to have married, at least there is no entry in the Almelund parish records.

Without checking local records and newspapers in the area it is difficult to conjure up how life in the new world affected P.J. and his wife. At any rate they maintained their connections with Sweden. P.J. seems to have remembered his uncle occasionally with a monetary gift. The uncle must not have been as badly off as he suggested since he had children in the vicinity. Perhaps his plea for assistance was one method of keeping up a continued contact? Perhaps Adam might have had close relationship with his nephew in light of the fact that two of Adam's children were given the name of Peter Johan.

I am seeking information on Johannes and Eva Stina Pettersson (both b. ca. 1820), who emigr. from Sweden to Trade Lake, Burnett County, WI around 1869. They had three children that I know of - Carl or Charles Alfred (my great grandfather), b. between Dec. 1858 and Jan. 1862; Johan or John, b. in June 1864 and Sophia or Josephine, b. 1866.

The information I have shows that Charles was b. in Småland and that in 1883 he moved from Wisconsin to Marshall County, MN and by 1885 had changed his name to Porten. In the same year the remainder of the family moved to Marshall County. In Jan. 1888 Charles Porten m. Mary Dahlberg, b. in Värmland in March 1862 and emigr. 1886. Between 1888 and 1903 they had eight children.

John, who also adopted the name Porten, m. twice and moved to Saskatchewan, Canada in 1906. I have no additional information on Josephine.


