2. Upon a **motion** by Sonja Knudsen and **seconded** by Mary Em Kirn, **the minutes of December 14, 1999 were approved.**
3. **Educational Policies – Rick Jurasek**

a. **ADD: CH301 Environmental Chemisty of Latin America**

This course will examine many of the environmental issues that confront Latin America from a molecular view. Several “natural” systems as well as those that have significant contamination will be studied. To be taught on Foreign Study Term, 00/01.

The course will only be offered on Foreign term in Latin America.

There was some concern about the 300 level designation for a course with no prerequisites. The Dean responded by stating that the course is in-line with other Foreign Term courses with 300 level designation. Students need to have 300 level courses during the Foreign term so that they can fulfill their 40 credit hours of 300 level and above coursework. Others suggested that perhaps Foreign term students could have a lower 300 level credit requirement. Other possible solutions to the 330 level credit problem were discussed but no additional motions were offered.

**Seconded** by Tom Bengston and **approved.**

b. **ADD: AR224 Computer Art II**

The Art Department proposes that AR 224 Computer Art II updates AR 224 Visual Communication and be offered during the academic year.

The course has been offered only in the summer, now it will be a regular departmental offering staffed by temporary staff.

The Dean was asked if the College was committed to offering the course on a continuing basis. The Dean replied that it was, probably with adjunct faculty for the present.

**Seconded** by Karin Johnson and **approved.**

c. **Final Examination Schedule: Revised Proposal**

The Final Exam schedule will be the same as was used last year.

**Seconded** by Dara Wegman-Geedey.

A **motion** was made by Bob Haak **to amend** Final Exam schedule so that there will be an additional multi-section exam Monday night, which is also used by evening courses. Evening courses will have priority over the multi-section final.

**Seconded** by Mike Wolf and **amended motion was approved.**

It was the will of the Faculty that the new Final Examination schedule be used beginning this Spring.

d. **Change of title of minor from Women's Studies to Women's and Gender Studies**

There will not be more staffing to fulfill the promise of the title. The title change is a reflection of the current emphases in the curriculum and is consistent with the change in name already adopted by the program.

**Seconded** by Dara Wegman-Geedey and **approved.**

e. **Change the name of the major from Speech Language Pathology/ Audiology to Communication Sciences and Disorders (old business)**

Rationale: This item was reported to Senate as information only at its December 14, 1999 meeting when it should have been presented for approval by Senate.

**Seconded** by Mike Green and **approved.**
